Navin Girishankar is currently the Adviser to the Senior Director of the Trade and Competitiveness Global Practice at the World Bank Group.

Navin has nearly twenty years of experience in the Bank Group's operation, finance and administrative complexes as well as in evaluation. He has led a number of flagship initiatives for the Bank Group including the 2015 Trade and Competitiveness Global Practice Roadmap, the 2011 independent evaluation of the World Bank's Governance and Anticorruption Strategy, the Bank Group's 2009 innovative finance taskforce, its 2007 trust fund management framework, and its 2005 Africa capacity building taskforce.

While in operations, Navin led and supported operations on governance, subnational and spatial development, competitiveness, urban development, and ICT in Egypt, Ethiopia, Malawi, OECS, Uganda, South Africa, and Zambia. He was also based in the Bank's Addis Ababa Country Office on extended assignment in the early to mid-2000s. In this most recent assignment, Navin was Adviser in the Competitive Industries and Innovation Program, where he was responsible for strategy and donor relations, program management, and various knowledge products.

He has published and spoken extensively on a range of topics such as governance, risk management, fiscal federalism, innovative finance, competitiveness, and political economy issues. Prior to joining the World Bank, Navin worked as a Policy Analyst at the Democratic Leadership Council and Progressive Policy Institute. He holds degrees from Harvard University and Williams College.
